- Confirm registration and academic calendar time frames and deadlines
- Change of major requests and declaring minor
- Study abroad planning
- Explain how to complete honors/departmental scholarship applications
- Provide letters of support to financial aid
- Process unit increase requests
- Review enrollment exception requests for late course adds/drops/change of grade option
- Meet with students for walk-in and/or scheduled appointments
- Monitor student progress
- Place students on academic probation, contracts, & disqualifications

- Review Part-Time Status requests
- Withdrawals & readmission
- Work Commencement & grad hooding
- New student orientation for freshman and transfers

- Table at Fall Preview Day and Celebrate UCI (central admissions yield events)
- Personalized tours of the Arts Campus (conducted by PAAs)
- Review applications and coordinate audition and portfolio results

- Attend classes – participation and attendance is key
- Manage your time
