# *Flat As The Tongue Lies* Ella de Búrca

**IRVINE, Calif.** – UC Irvine's Room Gallery is pleased to present new works by Ella de Búrca in her first U.S. solo exhibition *Flat As The Tongue Lies*, as a part of the University Art Galleries (UAG) Emerging Artist Series. The exhibition will open Saturday, September 29, 2018, with a reception from 2:00 – 5:00 p.m.

In *Flat As The Tongue Lies*, Ella de Búrca presents an installation of sound, text, kinetic sculpture and video. Using the structure of a three-act play, the installation explores the formation of meaning through reading, writing, and speech. The exhibition begins with *Prelude*, a sound piece that echoes the artist's voice, leading you through a corridor into the rest of the gallery. At the end of passage, you encounter *Act I*, a text piece projected on the screen of a monitor and ends with *Act II*, a play printed as a takeaway for you to read. In the backdrop of the gallery, a stop-motion animation titled *Lines* is projected, functioning as an abstract visualization of the three-act play. Meanwhile, a sculpture titled *Stage* moves as if breathing in the corner of the gallery.

In reference to eighteenth-century closet dramas — plays that are meant to be read alone or in a small group rather than produced — de Búrca's exhibition is an imagined stage for a play that is never performed. *Flat As The Tongue Lies* constructs a space that hovers between interiority and exteriority, and, accordingly, the public and private. The installation is a reflection on current forms of censorship in a moment when male-dominant discourse continues to determine the framework through which women can express narratives about their bodies.

Ella de Búrca works within the medium of performance, sculpture, and poetry to explore how meaning is constructed. She is interested in how we perform as a spectator and observing the unwritten rules for audience engagement within art institutions.

The exhibition is accompanied by a limited print publication with an essay by the curator.

## About de Búrca:

Ella de Búrca is an Irish born artist who currently lives and works in Brussels. Recent exhibitions include: *Post-Peace* at Württembergischer Kunstverein, Stuttgart, Germany and Nest, Den Haag, Holland (2017); *Coup de Ville Triennale* - WARP, Belgium (2016); *Slow Future* at The Centre of Contemporary Art, Warsaw, Poland (2014); *Playing Nature* at The Moscow Biennale of Contemporary Art (2013); *ReBuilding Utopia* at The Emergency Pavilion, The 53rd Venice Biennale (2013).

## **Unzicker Bio:**

Allyson Unzicker received her MFA in Critical & Curatorial Studies at UC, Irvine and is currently the Associate Director of the University Art Galleries (UAG). Previously she was a curatorial assistant for both Getty initiatives Pacific Standard Time: Art in LA 1945-1980 on *L.A. Xicano* (2011) and *Civic Virtue: The Impact of the Los Angeles Municipal Art Gallery and the Watts Towers Arts Center* (2011) and Pacific Standard Time: LA/LA on *Home–So Different, So Appealing* (2017). She was also curatorial assistant at the Vincent Price Art Museum where she curated *Corporeal Impulse: Works in Clay* (2014). She has curated numerous exhibitions at the UAG including: *On This Island* by Rosalind Nashashibi (2016); *MIXTAPE: Goodbye street, Goodbye home* by Shagha Ariannia (2015); *Paradox in Language: What I look at is never what I wish to see* (2015); and *A Twice Lived Fragment of Time* by Will Rogan (2013).

**Description:** Building on the Beckettian tradition, *Flat As The Tongue Lies* uses a 3-act structure to explore the formation of meaning through reading, writing and speech. The exhibition's title contrasts the corporeality and ambiguity that bookend the spectrum of language production, while the exhibition itself focuses on the artist's voice to challenge patriarchal discourse.
