Students and faculty cherished her presence and valued her wise professional advice she generously shared. Ms. Trevor's commitment to the students never wavered.

In 2000, our school became the Claire Trevor School of the Arts when Ms. Trevor's stepsons, Peter and Donald Bren, acknowledged her legacy as an artist and her commitment to future artists and performers with a transformational gift to support three endowed professorships, expanding the arts educational outreach programs, and each department's greatest needs. Ms. Trevor's passion and dedication lives on in the work happening in our classrooms, studios, and stages each and every day.

R. Luke DuBois is a composer, artist, and performer who explores the temporal, verbal, and visual structures of cultural and personal ephemera. This exhibition will explore the various ways that DuBois uses video and processed computational sound to construct new works. DuBois uses sound and speech to create beautiful drone-like music videos of various musicians playing instruments in slow motion. It is his manipulation of sound through programming that transforms Music into Data to Data into Music.
