CTSA 23-24 Research & Innovation Grants

The Research & Innovation Advistory Committee (RI Committee), led by the Associate Dean of Research & Innovation, Jesse Colin Jackson, evaluated 33 research proposals as they looked to award the 2023-2024 Research & Innovation Grants. The RI Committee distributed \$44,000 to the 17 grant awardees. \$6,000 grand prizes were awarded to Professor Joel Veenstra and Professor Jennifer Bornstein.



Claire Trevor Society Department Grants

With your support, CTSA is one of the nation's most acclaimed and innovative cultural centers dedicated to the study of visual and performing arts. To sustain this reputation, our school needs to be able to experiment with new ideas and endeavors. The Claire Trevor Society Department Grants enable the Departments of Art, Dance, Drama and Music to pursue ambitious creative projects, provide our students with transformative experiences and deepen our connections and impact within the community. Looking ahead to the 2024–2025 academic year, these grants will support the development of the following initiatives:

Visiting Artist Lecture Series (VALS): VALS is an annual series presented by the Department of Art and organized by faculty and graduate students. The series brings boundary-pushing artists directly to students, inspiring them with new and culturally diverse artistic ideas. Funding will be used to expand the program and its resources.

Yong Soon Min Exhibition: The Department of Art will use the grant's funding to present the *Yong Soon Min* Exhibition from October 5 - December 14, 2024. This exhibition will honor the late Professor Emerita of Art, Yong Soon Min, for her contributions to UC Irvine and the art sector. This project is being curated by Bridget Cooks from the Department of Art History and is a collaboration with Langson Institute and Museum of California and Yong Soon Min's estate.

Reimagining Journeys to Success: The Department of Dance will use this funding to support workshops for students, faculty and community members. These workshops, hosted in two parts, will focus on student professional development, interdisciplinary partnerships and





Creative Leadership Bridge Project: The Department of Drama will use this funding to launch an initiative to advance cutting-edge arts research and innovative productions. This initiative will promote curriculum innovation, foster student professional development, facilitate interdisciplinary collaborations, nurture community partnerships and invest in future growth. The culmination of this project will be Drama's spring 2025 musical. Starmites.

Expanding Music Student Pathways: The Department of Music will use these funds to support a graduate student-led speaker series, the vocal arts students' *Liederabend* recital and a career pathways panels by Jazz Program alumni. Additionaly, the grant will support composition readings and a panel on performance careers by members of the International Contemporary Ensemble.
