# FACULTY ACCOLADES

The Phatory in New York City was pleased to present *Security Blanket*, an exhibition of textile works by **Dean Joe Lewis**. In his first solo show at The Phatory,



Dean Lewis explored, through a series of photographically manipulated and quilted textile works, the ways in which our citizenry is beheld and expunged in the name of security.

As part of Princeton University's Institute for Advanced Study, **Dance Professor Sheron** Wray recently presented her talk The Multi-Logics of West African Improvisations (And Some Others). Professor Wray is developing Africological Improvisation, a conceptual framework inspired by research in Ghana, Guinea, and Cuba, combined with Euro-American dance and music forms as well as technology. In this conversation, she discussed "Embodiology," a new paradigm in which body, voice, music,

technology, and audience meet to co-create in the present.

Art Professor Connie Samaras' solo show *Tales of Tomorrow* runs through June 9 at Armory Center for the Arts, 145 North Raymond Avenue, Pasadena and was favorably reviewed in Artforum Magazine.

Professor Samaras was also featured in UC Riverside's Free Enterprise: The Art of Citizen Space Exploration, the first contemporary art exhibition in the U.S. to present an international array of artists and organizations



that are exploring the potential democratization of space exploration and the intersection between artistic production and civilian space travel.

Dance Professor Mary Corey recently completed her notation of the technique of modern dance pioneer Hanya Holm, a project commissioned by the University of New Mexico and funded by the National Endowment for the Arts.

Art Professor Ulysses Jenkins recently participated in a panel discussion with three other artists who exhibited at The

Art Dock, the world's first drive-by art gallery. Carlton Davis, author of *The Art Dockuments*, presented



the story of the gallery followed by "The Drive-by Gallery in Downtown LA: Revisited and Reassessed" at the Armory Center for the Arts in Pasadena.

Music Professor Nina Scolnik
was recently Artistic Director
and featured pianist in Holocaust
Remembrance: Silenced but not
forgotten, a concert to honor
composers censored during
the Holocaust in Winifred Smith
Hall. She worked with the
Simon Wiesenthal Center to
obtain artwork for the program

cover, and presented a carefully

researched selection of work.

Chancellor's Professor of Drama
Bryan Reynolds just staged
Fractalicious! which he wrote
and starred in; it was also
directed by second year doctoral
student Guy Zimmerman, and
choreographed by Drama
alumna Kayla Emerson (MFA
