2024-25 Research & Innovation Grants

The UCI Arts Research & Innovation (R&I) Grant program supports projects that feature cutting-edge research and interdisciplinary collaborations. The R&I Advisory Committee reviewed a competitive pool of 34 research proposals from UCI Arts faculty and graduate students requesting a total of \$140,000 for the 2024-25 academic year. A total of \$50,000 were awarded to 20 projects to fund an array of research, performances and exhibitions.

Claire Trevor Society Department Grants

With your support, UCI Arts has become one of the nation's most acclaimed and innovative centers for the study of visual and performing arts. To maintain this reputation, we must continue to explore bold ideas and new directions. The Claire Trevor Society Department Grants make this possible by empowering the Departments of Art, Dance, Drama, and Music to launch ambitious creative projects, offer students transformative experiences, and strengthen our impact within the community. Looking ahead to the 2025–2026 academic year, these grants will help bring the following initiatives to life:

The Inoperative Community: Exhibition X Practice, 1965–2025

The Department of Art will use the grant to support an archival exhibition of the University Art Galleries (UAG) from 1965 to the present. Drawing its title from Jean-Luc Nancy's seminal essay "Inoperative Community," which imagines community as non-hegemonic and fluid, the exhibition positions UAG's history not as a linear narrative but as a dynamic, collective moment where diverse voices and practices converge and shift over time. In doing so, it broadens awareness of and honors UAG's impact on UCI and the wider field of art practice.

Department of Music Key Initiatives

The Department of Music will offer a series of masterclasses and special events to enhance students' artistic and professional development. Students will gain hands-on experience in event organization through partnerships with the Music Undergraduate Student Association (MUSA) and the Music Graduate Student Organization (MGSO). The program is designed to serve a wide spectrum of students, including vocal arts, jazz, instrumental classical and ICIT PhD students.





The Community Bridge Project

The Department of Drama will provide students with hands-on, professional experiences and interdisciplinary opportunities. Students will participate in a multi-year residency with South Coast Repertory, gaining accredited training, mentorship and exposure to a professional theatre environment. The project will also hire guest artists and professional collaborators to enhance department productions, offering students direct mentorship and creative collaboration. In addition, guest artists and speakers will lead talkbacks and presentations, connecting productions to research, social themes and professional pathways.

Success Reimagined: Building New Pathways

The Department of Dance will use this funding to create innovative, multimodal experiences that emphasize student professional development, foster interdisciplinary collaboration and strengthen community engagement. By bringing in distinguished guests to lead specialized two-part workshops on targeted genres and topics, the department will provide students with immersive opportunities that combine artistic exploration with practical skill-building.
