Student Status:

Full-time minimum of 12 units per quarter

> You must register and complete 12 units to maintain full-time status. Full-time status is required each quarter if you live on campus, have financial aid, for certain scholarships, or are a UCI athlete.

Normal 16 units per quarter

> In order to make normal progress toward your degree, you not only need to take the correct courses, but you also need to take approximately 16 units most quarters during the academic year.

Maximum No more than 20 units per quarter, unless you have prior approval from your counselor and a cumulative

GPA of 3.0 or higher. If you plan to take more than 20 units, you must get the approval from an academic counselor before you add the class.

Part-time requires a petition; a max of 10 units may be taken, a minimum of 2

The University accepts only 3 reasons for part-time study (and part-time fees): health, family responsibilities, and employment of more than 20 hours/week (documentation required).

A note about units: a unit represents an average of 3 hours of work each week, both in and out of class. Therefore, a 4 unit course would mean an average of 12 hours per week. A normal academic load of 16 units would mean an average of 48 hours per week of class work in and out of the classroom/studio/theatre.

Class Level: Freshman: 0 - 44.9 Sophomore: 45.0 - 89.9 Junior: 90.0 -134.9 Senior: 135 +

Lower-Division and Upper-Division:

Courses numbered 1 - 99 are lower-division, usually considered Freshman/Sophomore classes, which are preparation for more detailed and focused upper-division work.

Courses numbered 100 - 199 are upper-division, usually considered Junior/Senior classes which often have prerequisites of lower-division work. (200-300 numbered courses are graduate courses and require approval)
