Advancement to Candidacy: Three Qualifying Papers The three qualifying papers must be completed by the end of the 3rd year. The normative time for students to pass the Qualifying Examination and Advance to Candidacy is at the end of their third year; students MUST advance to candidacy no later than the end of fall quarter of their fourth year.

Dissertation Defense:		

A total of 144 quarter units in graduate (200+) or approved upper-division undergraduate (100-199) courses must be completed with a grade of at least "B" in each course. Forty of these units are taken in required seminars; the balance is made up of elective seminars, independent study and research projects (including preparing the three qualifying papers), and dissertation research. Normative time for completion of the degree is five years; total registered time in the Ph.D. program at UCI or UCSD cannot exceed seven years.
