

- Valuable elder care resources through Years Ahead
- Discounts on tutoring, test prep, and enrichment classes
- Tuition discounts at partner centers
- Discounts on a local, high-touch placement service of trained, screened nannies

International Students

Under the Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) sanctions regulations, online courses to an individual in a country subject to comprehensive sanctions, including Cuba, Iran, North Korea, Syria, and the Crimea region of Ukraine, **is an export of regulated services** that may require a license. Effective October 29, 2020 OFAC published a new authorization, General License M[2], for certain graduate students located in Iran participating in **graduate degree programs in the humanities**, **social sciences**, **law**, **or business** or who are taking introductory science, technology, engineering, or mathematics courses ordinarily required for the completion of graduate degree programs in the humanities, social sciences, law, or business.

- Does NOT apply to graduate students in STEM degree programs
- The exportation of software may be authorized
- Students must have been granted an F (students) or M (non-academic students), non-immigrant visa by the U.S. State Department
- Students must not be physically present in the United States due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- This authorization is valid through September 1, 2021.

License determinations are made by the location's Export Control Officer, who will review the proposed activity and apply for a specific license when one is needed. Reach out to Amy Green acgreen1@uci.edu, Research Compliance & Policy Administrator for UCI if you have additional questions.
