Online Now: New BA and BMus Degree Details

CTSA Student Affairs has now published the full degree requirement checklists (link below) for the newly updated BA and BMus degrees that will be in effect for students entering UCI in Fall 2025. As announced earlier, all currently enrolled music majors may continue in their current degree program that was in place when they entered UCI, and all current BA Music students who have yet to audition for the BMus may still do so, as usual. In other words, if you are already in the music major, you can continue doing the degree path you came her intending to do, including advancing to the BMus, and the department will fully support that. However, if you are a current music major continuing next year, and you wish to consider switching over to one of the new degree options, please start by carefully reviewing the degree requirement checklists linked below.
