Online Now: New BA and BMus Degree Details

CTSA Student Affairs has now published the full degree requirement checklists (link below) for the newly updated BA and BMus degrees that will be in effect for students entering UCI in Fall 2025. As announced earlier, all currently enrolled music majors may continue in their current degree program that was in place when they entered UCI, and all current BA Music students who have yet to audition for the BMus may still do so, as usual. In other words, if you are already in the music major, you can continue doing the degree path you came her intending to do, including advancing to the BMus, and the department will fully support that. However, if you are a current music major continuing next year, and you wish to consider switching over to one of the new degree options, please start by carefully reviewing the degree requirement checklists linked below. If you have specific questions after doing that, you can either contact a CTSA Student Affairs Academic Advisor and/or come to our next all-students meeting (announced below).

 - Specific room(s) requested
 - o Date(s) and time(s) of intended use
 - Purpose of the reservation (e.g., practice, rehearsal, recording)

Key Checkout:

- Keys are available for pickup during designated hours only; no exceptions will be made outside these times.
- Keys must be returned by the next business day.
- A **\$100 fine** will be imposed for each lost key.

Thursday, May 15th – Influences on The Beatles, and the Anxiety of The Beatles' Influence

Our Musicology lecture series continues with Prof. **Mark Spicer**, a leading scholar and theorist of rock and popular music. This two-part talk begins with a consideration of how The Beatles, both as songwriters and as performers, drew influence from the many American artists of the 1950s and 60s whom they admired. It then takes up the music of two British groups from the 1970s—the Electric Light Orchestra and 10cc whose music cannot be fully understood without taking into account the profound influence of The Beatles. The lecture will take place in the third floor colloquium room in CAC, May 15, 4 pm.
